Located in north Louisiana, the campus has a student body of 570 students in Pre-K through 12th grade. Students are drawn to Cedar Creek from rural communities, small towns, and mid-sized cities from seven parishes by the school's reputation for academic excellence. Cedar Creek practices an open non-discriminatory admission policy.

ACCREDITATION AND MEMBERSHIP

Cedar Creek School is accredited by the Southern Association of Independent Schools (SAIS). The school holds membership in SAIS, the Louisiana High School Athletic Association (LHSAA), and Independent School Management (ISM).

CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Cedar Creek School offers an expanded college preparatory curriculum. In 2026-2027, Cedar Creek moved from a traditional seven period schedule to a modified block eight course schedule for high school. Career internship opportunities are available for seniors. Students are asked to complete a minimum of ten hours of community service each school year. **Twenty-five and a half credits are required for graduation in the following subject areas:**

Cedar Creek School does not rank its students, rather a quartile is determined, based on all students and on all subjects. All subjects are college preparatory. Grade point average is weighted. Honors, Pre-AP, and Advanced Placement courses receive additional weight.
